### **Fostering Success One Baby At A Time**

Two years ago, St. Clair Shores Mom Melissa Piaseczny simply posted on Facebook that she was thinking about becoming a foster parent. A friend connected her with Foster Home Development Supervisor Sarah Gies of Vista Maria and the journey began.

ast forward 24 months and Melissa has helped prepare three newborns, a two-year-old and a nine-year old for adoption readiness by serving as a foster parent. She typically fosters the children for three to five months until the children move to adoptive parents or are returned to their biological family.

"There's never a perfect time to make the decision to become a foster parent," said Melissa. "You'll always have an excuse why a different time would work better. Just get started and ask a lot of questions. Sarah made me feel comfortable and confident throughout the licensing process. I have learned that is OK to set boundaries that work for me and my family."

Melissa, a single Mom of a 12-year-old daughter, has learned that she prefers to help newborns rather than older children. She currently is fostering a two-month old baby boy who was born with marijuana in his system.

"He's a beautiful boy," added Melissa. "My role is to serve as a bridge. I can give comfort and care to a drug-addicted baby so that a Mom and Dad are set up for success when he is ready to be adopted or reunited with family."

Melissa works for a very supportive employer. As part of the technology team at Rock Connections, she works from home most days. The company also gives her 10 paid parental leave days and a \$1500 stipend for each foster placement.

When asked what drives her to foster, Melissa shared that she came from an abusive home and that she feels every child deserves to be safe and feel loved. As the oldest child of four, her role was always to protect her siblings.

Melissa is very diligent about taking photos of the babies and children while they are with her. "No one deserves to have a big hole in their past," she said. "I



always give the new parents a link to a Google Drive filled with photos so the child can have memories. They change so much in those early days. That is my gift to the foster children."

"I am grateful to Sarah at Vista Maria," said Melissa. "She still helps me every time I have questions. Without her coaching, I don't think I would still be doing this two years later.
