HELPING YOUNG PEOPLE AND FAMILIES FIND EACH OTHER!

In 2022, Vista Maria leadership emersed themselves in training, coaching and consulting with experts in the field. We then launched our Family Driven Youth Engagement Model and rolled out additional training to all staff. Working together with parents, we are finding new ways to put the family first. We implemented a Parent Advisory Council, developed the role of Parent Ambassador, and hosted on- campus Family Engagement Events and Therapeutic Weekends. In early 2023, we recruited our first Parent Ambassadors to collaborate with parents, enabling them to effectively support their children's journey towards healing and permanency. Our focus on Family Driven Youth Engaged care enabled us to help Barbara. Barbara was trafficked and experienced substance abuse and self-harm. When Barbara entered our treatment program, she was lonely and withdrawn. Both her parents suffered from addiction, and she had no family connection for many reasons. While at Vista Maria, our team was able to find and connect with Barbara's grandmother. Over time, both received counseling and restored their relationship. Because of our family engagement efforts,

Barbara started to believe in her self-worth, found hope and reason to focus on her treatment. One family connection over time led to hope, healing and reunification. Our role is to empower families so that their youth can heal and build the family for success today, tomorrow and for a lifetime.





A LETTER FROM VISTA MARIA'S PRESIDENT

Dear Vista Maria Supporter,

2022 was a monumental year for Vista Maria. Despite the previous trials of the COVID-19 pandemic, we rose to the occasion advocating for youth in our care. Our leadership team was on a tremendous endeavor and did not give up on working with the State of Michigan to finally receive residential rates that are equitable in today's economic growth. We also received the most grants for our programming in the history of Vista Maria. These partnerships between our Marketing and Fund Development team and generous donors enables our programs to further empower youth to move beyond trauma, heal and build a success filled life. As we see residential changes in the industry, our Family Driven Youth Engagement Model is specifically designed to decrease those lengths of stay and improve family relationships for the youth. Over the past two years, our foster care services have grown each year with at least thirty new youth we are protecting and empowering.

Our Wraparound Program that provides the support that youth and their families need to thrive in the community has grown 40% just since last year. We are blessed to have a great team that is living our values every day. Although there may be a change in the residential landscape to come for all residential programs across the state, we are looking at this as an opportunity for our Family Driven Youth Engagement Model to be embraced by those we serve.

As I say farewell, I reflect upon my tenure here at Vista Maria. We have grown from a \$19 million budget to a \$33 million organization with the acquisition of Insight Youth and Family Connections and the Michigan Abolitionist Project and the formation of Vista Affordable Housing. Under my leadership, we have embraced a commitment to Trauma Informed Care and have trained our entire staff to use this philosophy in all interactions. I will continue to be a fearless advocate for foster youth rights and services, as well as adolescent survivors of human trafficking. I invite you to wrap around our new leader with welcoming support and encouragement.

Vista Maria's Residential Mental Health Treatment Programs offer a range of specialized best practice models for delivering effective therapeutic treatment. Highly individualized treatment plans in a residential setting helps youth feel safe, build restorative relationships and see a future of possibilities.





JOURNEY TO SUCCESS TOTAL SERVED IN 2022: 72*

Youth in our Residential Mental Health Treatment Programs participate in afterschool programming called Journey to Success (JTS). Journey to Success enhances our Residential Mental Health Treatment Programs through expressive therapies, mentoring, academic support, team sports and life skills development. Supportive team members provide youth with opportunities to engage in extracurricular activities and discover new skills and abilities.

COMMUNITY INDEPENDENT LIVING TOTAL SERVED IN 2022: 60*

Vista Maria provides community-based living options for teens and young adults who need safe, affordable housing with the additional support of caring adults throughout Metro Detroit. Services include case management, employment support, life skills development, mentoring and counseling.

WRAPAROUND PROGRAM FAMILIES SERVED IN 2022: 47

Vista Maria's Wraparound Program provides the support that youth and their families need to thrive in the community. Through this voluntary program, a Vista Maria specialist helps families develop unique goals and build effective plans to achieve success, honoring the voice and choice of all family members.

HUMAN TRAFFICKING Survivor-centered wings program

TOTAL SERVED IN 2022: 10*

Vista Maria's Wings Program provides specialized care to address the unique needs of adolescent female survivors. The Wings Program provides critical services for survivors, from emergency stabilization to mental health treatment and ultimately to community reintegration to ensure wellness and restoration. With the addition of the Aaron and Helen L. DeRoy Freedom Center and Emergency Intake Wing, we are on the forefront of full continuum healing and advocacy for young survivors.



INTENSIVE Aftercare

Vista Maria's Intensive Aftercare Program begins the moment a youth enters our care. Our aftercare team members begin the process of successful discharge by supporting the family immediately and continuing support for 6 to 12 months or more post-discharge. Our team members are dedicated to family success.

FOSTER Care

Vista Maria provides General and Treatment Foster Care services for youth ages 0-25. Our dedicated foster care team provides the highest level of support, training and resources to families and children throughout the licensing and fostering process.
